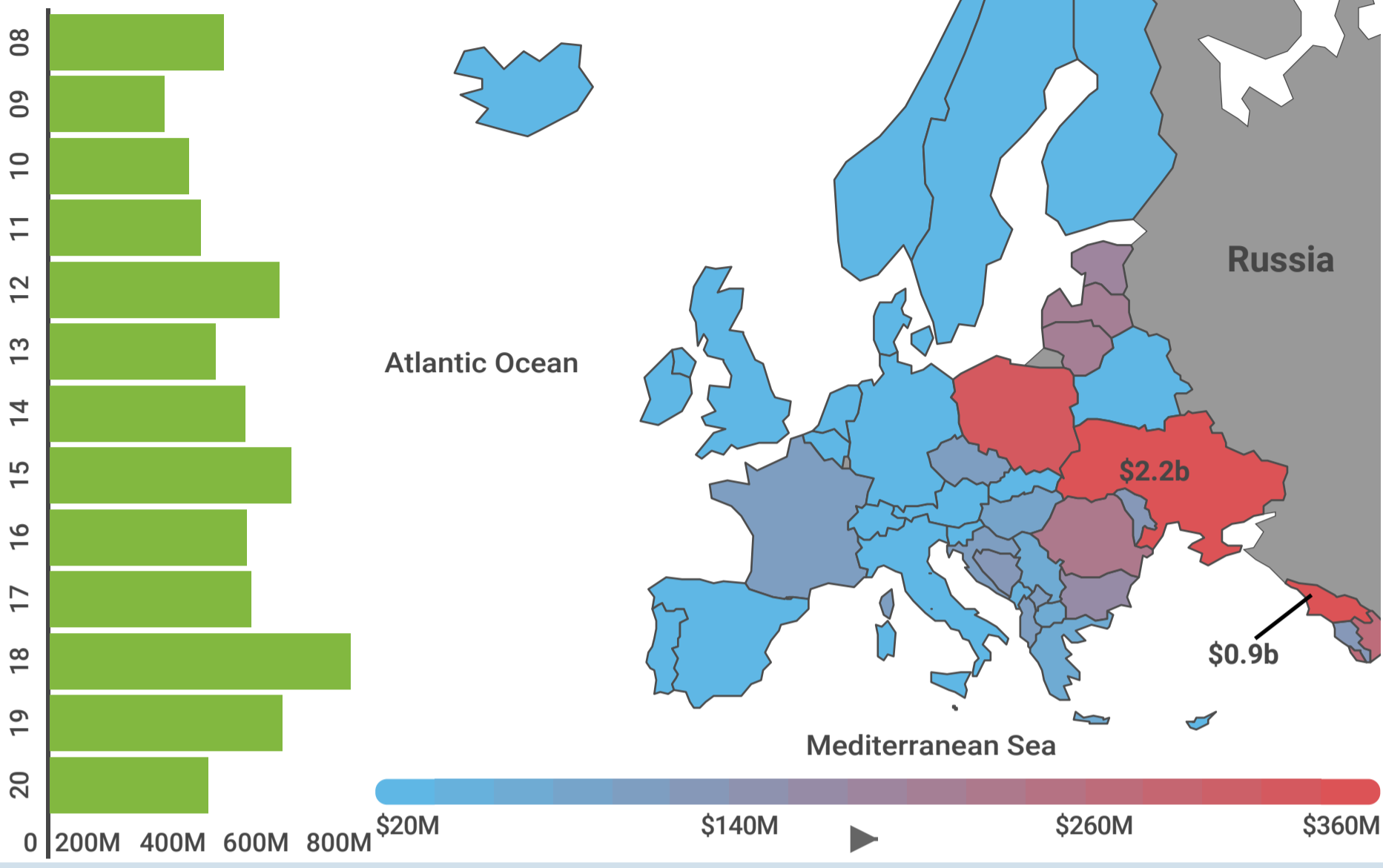


Great Power Rivalry through Security Assistance

U.S. Security Assistance To Eastern and Central Europe

Security Assistance for Eastern and Central Europe Since FY2008



The United States has utilized security cooperation with the objective of countering the regional influence of its great power rivals Russia and China. Since 2008, the U.S. has provided over one hundred million in security assistance to each of the frontline countries in Eastern and Central European, except for Belarus, and the countries surrounding the contentious South China Sea. Ukraine (\$2.2b), Georgia (\$0.9b), the Philippines (\$0.9b) and Indonesia (\$0.5b) are significant recipients.
