

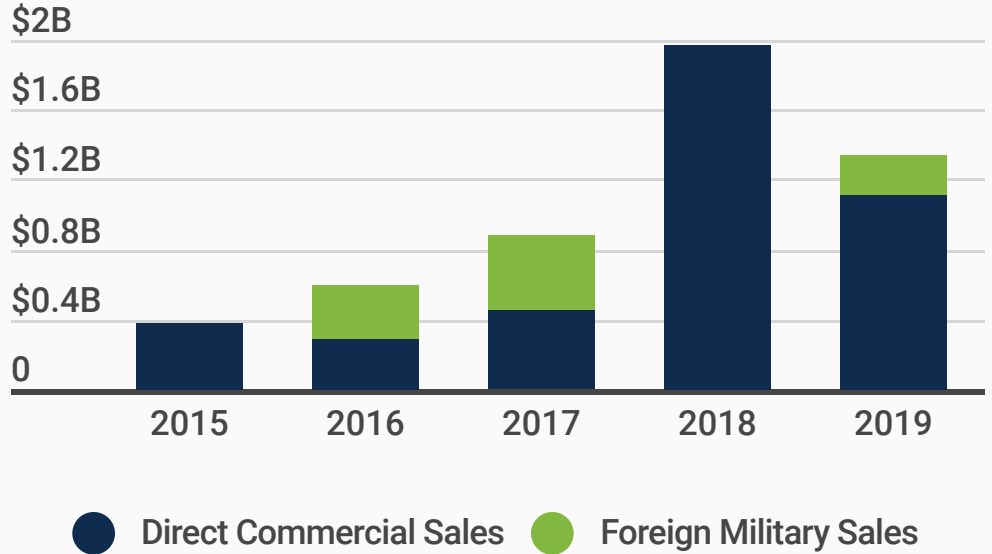
## US Arms Sales and Security Assistance to Israel

### Aid to Israel in Context

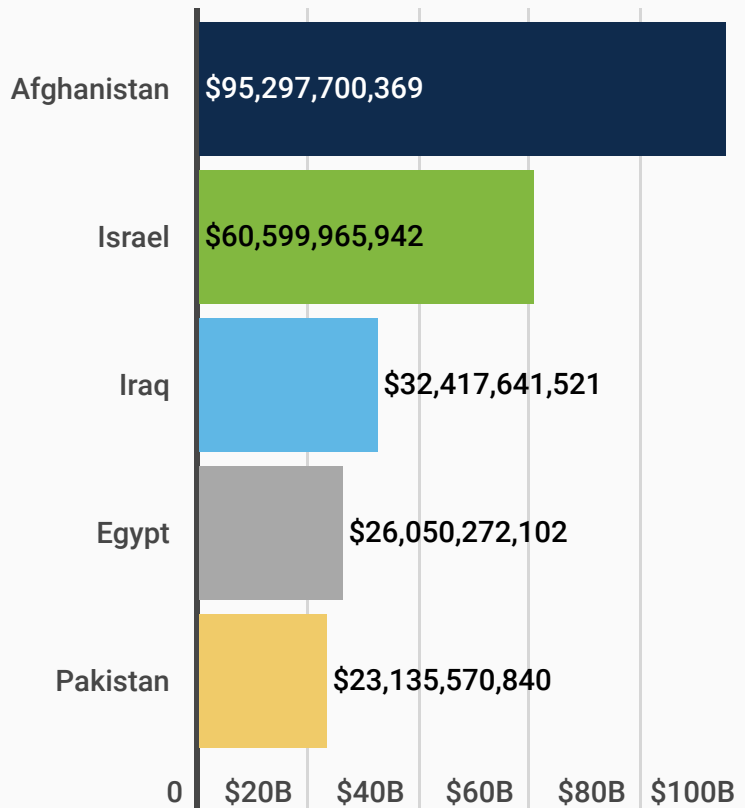
Israel has been the most significant recipient of U.S. security assistance, with more than \$3B allocated annually in recent years. Since FY2001, Israel has received over \$60B in security assistance, with over 90% funded by the State Department's Foreign Military Financing program, a grant program that provides money to purchase U.S. armaments.

Since 1999, assistance to Israel has been outlined in 10-year MOU's, with the latest pledging \$38B in military aid grants to purchase U.S. equipment and \$5B in defense appropriations joint missile defense development programs.<sup>1</sup>

### U.S. Arms Sale Notifications to Israel, FY15-FY19



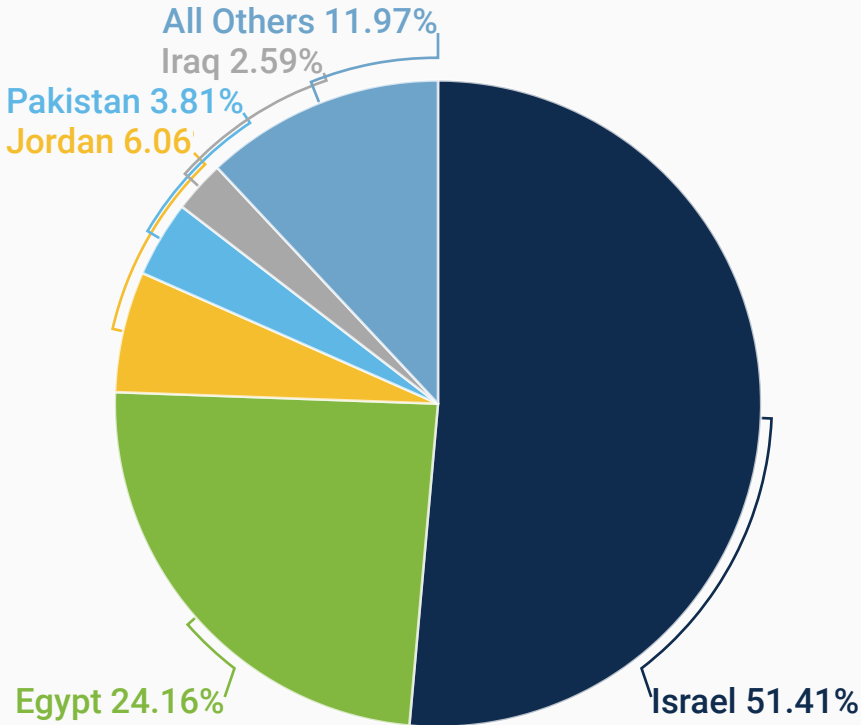
### Top 5 Recipients of U.S. Security Assistance Since FY2001



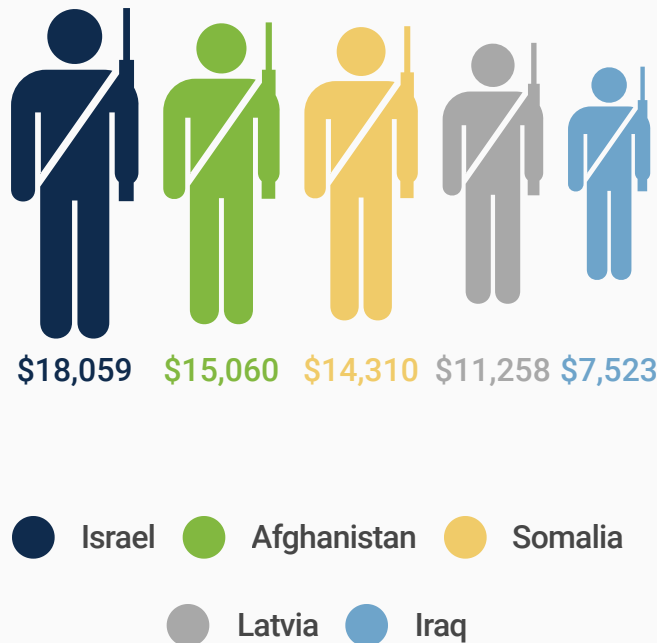
### Top 3 Foreign Military Sales to Israel Since FY2015

### US-Israeli Missile Defense Cooperation

The U.S. has spent billions in helping Israel develop its missile defense system, shouldering significant costs of Israel's four-layered active defense network. The current MOU outlining 10 years of U.S. security assistance to Israel includes a further \$5B for continued missile defense development

**Iron Dome:** Short Range Anti Rocket. US has provided \$1.56B to support the system since FY2011



**David's Sling:** Medium Range counter Missile System. Jointly developed by Rafael and Raytheon, with the U.S. contributing \$840M between FY2006-2015

**Arrow I & II:** Upper atmospheric anti ballistic missile. US has co-produced with Israel since 1988, and has funded just under half of annual cost



**Arrow III:** Exo-atmospheric missile defense system. US and Israel have co-produced since 2010.
